The Synchrotron or Canadian Light Source is one of the largest science projects in Canada's history. The facility speeds up electrons to produce intensely bright synchrotron light that helps scientists study materials at a molecular level. Over 1,000 researchers from around the world use the CLR every year. On the tour you will learn how the machine works and will be told how researchers have used the machine to conduct groundbreaking research in the fields of health, the environment and advanced materials. This tour will take place on Friday morning. We will leave the Hotel at 10 am, and travel to the University of Saskatchewan where the Canadian Light Source is located. The tour will take approximately one hour, then we will take our shuttle to downtown Saskatoon where we will have lunch at the Old Spaghetti Factory.
