We are also very pleased to announce that a Task Force Committee has been set up by the Grand Chapter of Saskatchewan OES Executive from the motion passed at "Celebrate the Strength of Our Stars" Session, April 29, 2023. The Task Force Committee members will consist of the Grand Line Officers, Chair of Finance, Chair of Jurisprudence, and Chair of the Grand Trustees.

The first Task Force Committee meeting will occur in mid-June 2023. All members, through their Subordinate Chapter Secretaries, will be kept updated on the progress and actions of this committee in the months to come.

Brother George Frederick Worthy Grand Patron stated the following at our April 30th Executive

Meeting and in his dedication. "We are getting to the point where the Grand Chapter of Saskatchewan may have to follow Quebec's lead, though we are confident not for some time." During the WGP's first year as Grand Trustee (2018), he plotted our decline in yearly membership and found that we would have folded by 2022. Since the WGP's initial assessment, the Grand Chapter of Saskatchewan has experienced a levelling off in losses and an increase in initiates which has improved our prospects until the early 2030's as of now.

As your Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, we are fully aware that the Grand Chapter of Saskatchewan OES is facing challenges regarding our current membership numbers. We believe that all OES members of our Grand Jurisdictions need to focus on our recent positive gains and, if we (all OES members) work toward increasing our membership numbers, we will significantly improve our Grand Jurisdiction's prospects of being around for many years to come. We hope that all our members will join us in working towards continuing OES membership growth in the coming year and future years.

Also, we would respectfully request that if you have sent us an email through the Grand Chapter Office or directly to the WGM or/and WGP's email addresses and there is no response, to please feel free to follow up by text or phone in a week or so if you have not received a response from us. Brother Tom Hannan, PGP

Tom Hannan was born on Sunday, July 16, 1922, when he became the 4th son born to Dawson and Elizabeth Hannan who lived in the Buck Lake District and later the town of Gray, just southeast of Regina.

Tom was uncle to 4 nieces and 5 nephews, grand uncle to 18 and great grand uncle to many more!

Tom graduated from Gray high school followed by a year at Normal School to become a teacher. His education was interrupted for 3 years when he joined the army but after discharge, he was able to obtain his Bachelor of Education degree from the University of Saskatchewan and a few years later, a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Regina.

He was a classroom teacher and principal for 20 years, teaching in several small southern Saskatchewan towns, including Gray, Craik, Lewvan, Avonlea and Milestone. In 1968 he began teaching at the Correspondence School here in Regina until 1986 when he retired.

Tom has been involved for many, many years with the Masons, the Order of Eastern Star and the Scottish Rite. He has been a faithful member of St Paul's Cathedral having been confirmed into the Anglican Church at a young age. He has been a volunteer for many outreach programs all his life and will always be remembered for his kindheartedness, thoughtfulness, patience, and genuine caring nature.

Tom was initiated into the Order of the Eastern Star 19 September, 1956 in Bowling Green Chapter # 83 at Colfax, then affiliated with Milestone #60 in 1973. He affiliated with our chapter April 1, 2007, but had been an Honorary Member of our chapter for many years In our chapter, he served as Warder and Worthy Patron, two years in a row with Sister Marianne Woods, PM.

He was WGP in 1967, with WGM Sister Isabel Welch in the "Garden of Prayer" year. Their motto was "Brighten the Corner Where You Are" and those of us who remember Tom know that is what he did for us – brightened our corner. Sister Rose Whaley, PGM, said to the Grand Chapter in 2016, the 50th anniversary of his installation as WGP, "He is the kind of fellow who works in a quiet unassuming way, with no thought of reward or recognition. But have no fear, you can always count on his sense of humor, which at times may raise an eyebrow." Brother Jack Smith submitted a request to General Grand Chapter for Brother Tom to be honored on the occasion of 50 years of

service as a Past Grand Patron, and Sister Donna Sanders, GGCCM, was pleased to present it to him. Tom, of course, - humble as always.

Tom's niece, Beth, described him best at his 100th birthday party: "You are loved and admired, and you have influenced us to always strive to do our best, help our fellow man, and to remember that above everything else, family comes first. You have done so not only with your encouraging words but in the quiet, humble way you have lived your life."
