#### The Ruling Power

"And God made two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, the lesser light to rule the night. He made the stars also." Genesis 1:16

The early Masonic Lodges of the Orient, known as the first most reverent intellectual and honoured of all organizations, established laws of principles that Robert Morris indoctrinated into our Order, because they established and represented the very fulfillment of the laws of God. The Holy Writ established the three "ruling bodies."

In the beginning people worshiped with their eyes toward the East because the rising sun made its appearance in the East, and it gave forth the reasonable source of all things.

The vegetation, humanity of life depended upon the rays of the sun for growth and strength, and as it set in the evening it became a period of rest and learning. The third source appeared as the stars spreading over the universe as a canopy of wisdom, justice, and love. Science states the moon changes shape but the stars remain in formation.

Though the intrinsic teaching of the Masonic principle and precept, Robert Morris evolved the design of an invisible Court between this earthly life and the life beyond. He designed the three highest officers as exalted dignitaries. The fourth was added in 1928 to complete the square of balance.

The Treasurer, Worthy Matron, Worthy Patron, and Secretary form the East wall, the Conductress on the centre South, Associate Conductress on the centre North. These are the elected officers into whose hands are placed the harmony and growth of a Chapter. They guard the Star's Holy Ground.

The Worthy Matron was designated as the ruler of the house, the Matron of all, who teaches the great lesson

of love and truth, gives relief to the destitute and distressed, comfort and protection to those in need.

The Worthy Patron, the messenger of intelligence and seven ties that bind, sees that the officers are proficient in their work, sees that the laws are obeyed and is the authority of the Masonic regulation of our membership fulfilment.

These two officers form a triangle with the open Bible on the Altar, a symbol of authority, wisdom, and justice. Those elected to the two important stations should be thoroughly capable of presiding without prejudice or partiality, governing with equal justice to all, using wisdom and discretion in their words and deeds.

The Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron are the leaders and examples to the membership and by their actions, words and deeds not only are they judged but the Order is judged. They hold the authority and disciplinary powers as the base of the triangle with the open Book and no one should disturb this harmonious vibration between God and man by passing between the Altar and the East unless designated to do so by the Ritual. Since the East is the "source" of authority, instruction and discipline, the teacher of wisdom, justice, and love, so should the officers emulated the virtues of their power and office.

The Secretary and Treasurer are elected and hold in their hands the records and financial status of the Chapter.

The West is the symbolization of the farewell of the effulgent sun, the lowering of the curtain of time, day, and life. The Associate Matron and the Associate Patron are at the period of rest preparing for a step onward and upward, versing themselves in law, principle, precept, and order. With their faces toward the light, they portray the peace, harmony, and strength toward the growth of membership and wisdom.

There is a third officer stationed near and not elected, yet, most important, the guardian of the portals of the gateway. Upon this officer rests the responsibility to see that security of a Chapter is not violate and unbroken, and labours for the peace and harmony of the Chapter. In the original work of the Order, the Officer of the centre South was inspired by Kings 1:10. This Officer, the Conductress, is most important as she symbolizes the invisible guide to every person who seeks admission to the Order. She is, as the Holy Scripture tells, a "light which lighteth every soul." Her work is all symbolic of truth. The Conductress leads the candidate toward the light, she presents the instruments used in building the Temple of Higher Self, thus helping to make the first impression lasting.

In ancient times, travellers were guided by the North Star, symbolizing a guide out of darkness, dispelling all fear. So, it is with the Associate Conductress in the centre North. When she appears to the candidate seeking light outside, she symbolizes Faith, Trust, and Hope. The candidate appreciates the advice given in the preparation room. The Associate Conductress should possess qualities of capability, a charming personality that will assure a seeker of light the seriousness of the steps ahead. The North is the office to be considered before the person. It is the first step upward and onward.

These eight elected officers compose the "Ruling Square" of a Chapter, in which the OES Square enfolds the Star with-in the beauty, peace and harmony of fraternal love of Sisterhood and Brotherhood symbolizing Truth, Honour and Justice in love and friendship, and should always be composed of those whose trustful dependability has been proven and whose bond of trust and respect is sustained by every member of the Order.

May each of us here today, with God's help, live our Order's Obligations, and be a living example of His love and truth.
